A Message from the Ven. Rhonda Waters

Liminal: of or relating to a transitional or intermediate state, stage, or period

We, the Parish of St. Helen's, are deep in a liminal time. There have been so many changes over the past few years that it is hard to keep up – changes in worship, in leadership, in membership, in context. These changes can leave us feeling a little unmoored, unsure of what's to come or how we get there. For some of us, this is an exciting feeling. For some of us, this is a distressing feeling. For most of us, I suspect, it's a little of both and, either way, it can be very tempting to attempt to shortcut this time in order to get on with whatever comes next.

Taking the shortcut, however, means missing out on the full beauty of the journey. Liminal times offer us the opportunity to look for what God is doing rather than focus on what we are doing and to allow our future to take shape on God's terms and in God's time.

Parish Council begins each meeting with a time of prayer, inspired by the teaching of St. Ignatius, in which we ask God to help us reflect on the life and ministry of St. Helen's so that we can discern what God is calling us to do and to be. If you would like to join in this prayer practice, set aside some time each month (council meets on the 3rd Monday if you want to pray at the same time) and use this quide.

Parish Examen – a prayer of discernment

Settle into silence and become aware of the presence of God. Ask for the gifts of clarity and understanding as you reflect on the life of our parish, here and now.

For what are you grateful? Allow the big things to come to mind but look closer, too. What encounter or experience or moment, whether significant or trivial, was a gift. Offer thanks to God. **silence**

As you think about our parish and all that has taken place over the past month, notice your emotions and reactions. Where have felt joy or energy? Where have you felt frustration or resistance? Where have you felt weariness or boredom? What might God be telling you – about St. Helen's or about yourself or about the wider world? **silence**

Ask God to direct your attention to one feature – one question or experience or feeling – from your reflections. Try not to interfere with God's work but simply follow where God is pointing, even if it seems like something insignificant. Pray about it, in whatever way seems best to you: intercession, or thanksgiving or repentance or praise. *silence*

Now turn your focus to the future and ask for God's guidance in the weeks to come. Notice the emotions that surface as you contemplate what's coming up. Are you doubtful? Excited? Nervous? Turn those emotions into prayer and commit the future to God's hands. *silence*.

In Jesus' name, we pray. Amen.

Mapping the Ground We Stand On - In 2015, as part of its commitment to support the findings of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission, PWRDF developed the "education for reconciliation" resource "Mapping the Ground We Stand On". This interactive workshop, also known as the Mapping Exercise, invites participants to explore Indigenous presence on the map of Turtle Island/Canada, the history of Settler arrival, and their relationship to one another. It also offers an opportunity for learning and

reflection on the concepts of *Terra Nullius* (empty land), the Doctrine of Discovery and Indigenous knowledge. As one of our actions in Truth and Reconciliation, St. Helen's is hosting two sessions of PWRDF's Mapping Exercise, on **Saturday. June 3** (9:00 am - 12:00 pm & 1:30 - 3:30 pm) facilitated by Audrey Lawrence and Karen Luyendyk. We are also honoured to welcome Inuk elder, Asenath Kannutaq, who will serve as a witness to the day and will light a quilliq. Asenath is a parishioner at St. Margaret's Vanier.
