

A gentle, prayerful service designed for those who find the season difficult due to loss, loneliness, illness, grief, challenging present circumstances or sad memories.

Note: Proof of double vaccination and photo ID (or medical exemption) will be required to enter the church for all reasons, including worship. **Pre - Registration for services is also still necessary** so that we can continue to keep contact tracing records. The requirement for reduced capacity has been lifted and people will be invited to keep physical distance themselves and to be sensitive of others' need to do so. If you are anxious about larger crowds please consider attending the 8 AM worship service. Masks will still be worn inside at all times. Other restrictions and procedures will change as needed. If you are not double vaccinated and wish to receive the sacrament, please call Susan+ in the office.

Ministry Opportunity: AV Technical Assistance

Volunteers are needed to assist with technical aspects of worship and wider ministry, including the following:

- 1. Operator of remote control of PowerPoint presentation (slides) during worship services. Required to arrive 15-30 minutes before the service begins to review the slide package that has been prepared for the service. Ideally, we would like to have a volunteer that could commit to doing this on a monthly basis. We are looking for 3 to 5 volunteers for this role.
- Audio control during services. Looking for someone with a good ear for music that is willing to learn about all aspects of our sound system, able to attend Emmaus rehearsals in preparation for the coming Sunday service and then to balance, mix and adjust sound levels as required during the service.
- 3. Audio and video control of live stream of service. Require someone that is able to learn about our setup for live streaming; including the operation of our camera(s), audio sources and computers and then to control audio and video and live stream software during a service.

Art Fair 2022 For Your Calendars...We had a successful virtual Art Fair last May with eighteen (18) artists participating, five of whom were from the parish, offering 137 art works for sale. Twenty-four (24) pieces of art were sold for a total of \$3,683, with \$2,771 going back to the local arts community. Entry fees for the Fair totaled \$685 with \$855.60 in commissions, resulting in a net revenue of \$1,440.60 for St. Helen's.

As majority of the artists indicated an interest in participating in another art fair with St. Helen's, we are encouraged to plan for another Art Fair. Council has approved a plan for an in-person Art Fair to be held on Saturday, May 28, 2022. There will be an option to change to a virtual Fair if conditions require but we will initially promote the Art Fair as an in-person event. Artists will be invited to participate and submit their art using our sthelensartfair.ca website which should be available later in November and will open for public viewing as soon as we have an artist's work to display. As an in-person Art Fair will require more support than the virtual Fair, a call for volunteers will be coming soon. If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact me. Shape of Parish Ministry The Diocesan-wide consultation, planned for 3 stages (April 2021-October 2022) is exploring the shape of parish ministry now and in the future. St. Helen's 'team' includes the clergy, Jeff McRae, Peter Humphries, Felicia Kwamena and Kathy Pearce. The first step in the parish was to get your feedback in response to the questions posed by the Diocese(June-August). Thank you to all those who contributed. We then distilled those thoughts and the group was interviewed(September)by The Ven. Mark Whittall and The Rev. Geoff Chapman(on the Diocesan team). They received our input and sent us an interim report which we then 'tweaked' and returned in November(now on our web site). With a limit of 2 pages, obviously not all of the ideas, concerns or turns of phrase are represented, but we hope the spirit of the input is in evidence. The report will be added to a Diocesan compendium of profiles from every parish in the Diocese. The next step in the Diocesan timeline will be taken in the new year.
