# A Message from the Venerable Rhonda Waters

Sometimes, when we call the church a family, we imagine something intimate and familiar; a place where everyone is known and so everyone belongs. But the household of God is bigger and wilder than that. We don't get to choose who shows up. We don't get to decide who belongs. We don't get to decide who is welcome. All of God's children are our brothers and sisters and siblings and so everyone belongs – which means we have a responsibility to get to know one another.

This month, as we begin to live into the amalgamation of St. Helen's Orleans with St. Mary the Virgin, Blackburn with St. Helen's, Orleans, let us all make a special effort to connect with people we don't know (including people we suspect we are supposed to know). Use a nametag when you are at church and be quick to introduce people to each other. Be generous in sharing your own stories and gracious in receiving those of others and rejoice in your membership in the wild and wonderful family of God!

## **Christmas & Epiphany Services**

Christmas Stories and Songs - Dec 18 at 4pm - Come hear the story of Christmas, told through an original script by Rhonda with carols and songs shared by St. Helen's Choir, Emmaus, and others! Stay for cookies, hot chocolate, and other Christmas treats in Trinity Hall.

**Appointment of an Assistant Curate at St. Helen's** On Sunday, Oct 23<sup>rd</sup>, it was announced that Bishop Shane has appointed John Holgate to the position of assistant curate at St. Helen's, starting on January 1<sup>st</sup>. John was ordained to the transitional deaconate on November 19<sup>th</sup> at 11am at Christ Church Cathedral, and we are looking forward to receiving his gifts for pastoral ministry, administration and community building.

**New Service Schedule for Epiphany Season** Starting on the Feast of the Epiphany (which we will celebrate on January 8<sup>th</sup>) and going until the Sunday before Lent (Feb 19<sup>th</sup>), we will offer three Sunday morning services, adopting the familiar schedule of 8:00, 9:15 and 11:00. The 8:00 service will continue unchanged. In January, the 9:15 service will have music led by Emmaus and the 11:00 service will have music led by the choir. In February, that will flip to the choir at 9:15 and Emmaus at 11:00. For the season of Lent, we will return to two services on Sunday at 8:00 and 10:00 and take some time to discern how to organize our worship from Easter onward. There will be ample opportunity throughout this process to provide feedback and maybe even dream up brand new possibilities for the future.

**Choir** The choir is excited to have a full season of music ministry ahead. New members are always welcome. Talk to any choir member, or just come out to a Thursday evening (7PM) practice!
