A Message from the Venerable Rhonda Waters

Chalking the Door

Blessing the home on or near the feast of Epiphany, in remembrance of the hospitality of the Holy Family when the magi visited their home to pay homage to the Christ Child, is a tradition that dates from the Middle Ages. Using chalk (which may be blessed for the purpose), mark your doorway with the inscription 20+C+M+B+23. The numbers indicate the year, containing crosses for Christ and the initials of the traditional names of the magi, **C**aspar, **M**elchior, and **B**althazar. The letters also stand for **C**hristus **m**ansionem **b**enedicat, (May Christ bless this house).

We will bless chalk at the Eucharist on Jan 6 and use it to mark blessings on our church homes at St. Mary the Virgin and St. Helen's. You are invited to pick up a piece of this chalk and a copy of the prayer below, on either the 6th or on Sunday the 8th, to mark a blessing on your own home as well.

Home Blessing Prayer

Standing on your doorstep

The Lord be with you *(or, if alone)* In the name of the Holy Trinity: **And also with you**

The wise ones followed God's star to Bethlehem, seeking the saviour. I will follow the star. They found Jesus in Bethlehem and knew they had found the one they were seeking. I will seek to recognize Jesus. They fell down and worshipped him, offering him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. I will offer my gifts to the Lord.

The door is marked **20+C+M+B+23** *while you say:* Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar followed the star of God's son who became human two thousand and twenty-three years ago. May Christ bless this home and each person who lives or visits here. Holy God, watch over *my/our* going out and *my/our* coming in throughout this year. Fill *me/us* with the light of Christ that *I/we* may grow in love, in wisdom, and in faith. **Amen**. A special thank you to everyone who assisted with the Advent and Christmas worship services, with decorating and baking and for your ministries throughout the season

Epiphany Sunday – **Jan 8 - 8, 9:15, & 11am at St. Helen's -** You are welcome to bring any donations you have collected over the month to be blessed before distribution to the Food Bank and Day Programs.

New Service Schedule for Epiphany Season Starting on the Feast of the Epiphany (which we will celebrate on January 8th) and going until the Sunday before Lent (Feb 19th), we will offer three Sunday morning services, adopting the familiar schedule of 8:00, 9:15 and 11:00. The 8:00 service will continue unchanged. In January, the 9:15 service will have music led by Emmaus and the 11:00 service will have music led by the choir. In February, that will flip to the choir at 9:15 and Emmaus at 11:00. For the season of Lent, we will return to two services on Sunday at 8:00 and 10:00 and take some time to discern how to organize our worship from Easter onward. There will be ample opportunity throughout this process to provide feedback and maybe even dream up brand new possibilities for the future.
