A Message from the Rev John Holgate

Hello!

Some of us have been at St. Helen's for a long time, while others have joined only recently. And some show up for the first time, curious about what goes on in that big building on Prestone Drive. We all are coming together as part of Christ's body, although some may not realize that yet or even know what that means.

Our congregation is a community of individuals who have come to love each other, through good times and bad. That intimate setting is an extension of God's love. But that intimacy can sometimes accidentally exclude newcomers or those who come to church occasionally.

Jesus reminds us of the fundamental value of hospitality when he talks about being a stranger and being welcomed, fed, and clothed (Matthew 25:31–46). We need to remember that everyone here, both people we know and those we don't, are in this together, because "[we] are no longer strangers and aliens, but ... are citizens with the saints and also members of the household of God" (Ephesians 2:19). So, we are called to a ministry of hospitality towards those who are perhaps just starting out with us or who are unsure of their commitment. They are perhaps searching for faith after undergoing a period of change in their lives. Or maybe they are testing us, to see if we are a welcoming community with an attitude of inclusion and a willingness to accommodate their life circumstances.

Interestingly, newcomers often make the decision about whether to return within minutes of their first visit. So, we need to be welcoming from the start.

If you see someone you don't know at church, please say hello and introduce yourself to them. And don't worry about introducing yourself to someone who is a long-time member at St. Helen's: we are a big church with lots of members. You might make a new friend or two along the way.

Annual Vestry – Please note that the annual Vestry meeting will occur on February 26 after the 10 am service. **Annual reports are due not later than February 12**.

Honorary Assistants Appointed Honorary Assistants are volunteer clergy, either retired or engaged in ministries outside of parishes. As they are able, they share their experience and skills with the parish and provide much appreciated support and friendship to the clergy on staff. *Honoraries* are appointed by the incumbent with the permission of the bishop – which means that when an incumbent leaves, the appointment ends.

With great joy, Rhonda has **re-appointed the Rev. Kay Richardson** who is well-known and well-loved at St. Helen's. We look forward to her return from Florida!

Rhonda has also received permission to **appoint the Rev. Canon Hilary Murray** as an honorary assistant at St. Helen's. Hilary brings with her a wealth of experience as a priest, a social worker, and, in her current position, Clinical Chaplain at Cornerstone Housing for Women. Ash Wednesday Services, Feb. 22nd

- 11:00am Said Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes (no music, no sermon)
- 7:30 Sung Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes (both music and sermon)

Renewing our Liturgical Ministries

Each Sunday in Lent (except Vestry Sunday and Palm Sunday), after the 10am service, we will hold a one-hour session on a different liturgical ministry. If you currently serve in this area, you are **very strongly** encouraged to attend but, if you don't, you are also encouraged to attend. The liturgy is our shared work and this is an opportunity to deepen our practice and our understanding.

- March 5 Praying the Prayers of the People: intercessors and all who pray with them
- March 12 Gathering God's People: sidespersons and welcomers
- March 19 Proclaiming Scripture in the Assembly: readers and hearers
- March 26 Serving at the Altar: servers, altar guild, and lay administrants

Renewing our Baptismal Ministry

This 5 week course will prepare you to be baptized or to reaffirm your baptism at Easter. We will explore some of the basics of Anglican beliefs and practices, drawing in part on the book *To Love and Serve: Anglican Beliefs and Practices.* You do not need to purchase the book but, if you are interested, it is available as an e-book from Amazon (\$10) or in hardcopy from the Anglican Church book store. If you want to purchase a hardcopy, let Rhonda know and she will arrange for the group rate of \$25/book. Dates and times to be determined but contact Rhonda with questions or requests.

Thursday Morning Prayer and Chat during Lent

During the season of Lent, we are invited to take the time to reflect and pray about the world and about ourselves, both corporately – as a group – and individually. Starting February 24, on Thursday mornings during Lent we will hold a gentle short service of Morning Prayer at St. Helen's in the church at 9:00 AM. The service includes Scripture readings and prayer and is a good way to focus our thoughts and to perhaps experience some insights. You are invited to join in, bringing your cares and concerns or simply your desire for some guiet reflective time.

Also on Thursdays from 9:30 until 11:00 AM, there will be a chance to have coffee or tea and to chat with each other and with John, our Assistant Curate, about whatever is on our minds. You can stay after the service or drop by whenever you can.

Meal Program - The Sunday Community Meal is a core feature of St. Margaret's parish ministry; it is an extension of God's hospitality experienced in worship around the Eucharistic table, bringing parishioners and neighbours together in fellowship around food at tables in the parish hall. As an Inuit-led feature of the parish ministry, it embodies the leadership, gifts, and cultural hospitality of the St. Margaret's Inuit congregation. The St Margaret's Sunday Community Meal Team is composed of volunteers, clergy, and contracted support workers, including a Community Host - a newly created contract position. The purpose of the Community Host is to support and enhance the hospitality offered by parishioners with valuable frontline skills to welcome,

inform, engage, and respond if needed to escalating behaviors with appropriate de-escalation skills. The Sunday Community Meal is offered regularly from September to June.
