A Message from our Music Director - Carl Bear

Hello!

Last Friday, some members of St. Helen's gathered with other Anglicans from Ottawa for a visit to T&T Supermarket, followed by a potluck dinner and conversation. The event, organized by Project Anti-Racism, focused on how eating food from different cultures and parts of the world can be "a way in to hear each other's stories." Similarly, singing songs from different cultures and parts of the world during worship can also be "a way in" to connecting with Christians from around the world and close to home. Singing a variety of music from different times and places during worship is also an act of hospitality, a recognition that everyone who is present in worship has their own experiences and stories of music that they bring with them.

February is Black History Month, and for the season of Lent we will be honouring Black musical contributions during worship. Some of our service music will come from "Welcome Table: A Mass of Spirituals" by Dr. Kim Harris, a Black Catholic woman who teaches at Loyola Marymount. Each piece sets traditional liturgical texts to different Spiritual melodies, such as the Sanctus, set to "OI' Time Religion," and the Agnus Dei, set to "My Lord! What a Morning." We will also be singing service music from *Sing a New Creation*, the new Anglican hymnal supplement, including a Kyrie by Ghanaian composer, Dinah Reindorf, and a traditional Tanzanian song as a Gospel Acclamation. May these songs and others, both familiar and new, be "ways in" to hearing each other's stories.
