You Are Leaven - Fermenting Cultures of Spiritual Formation by Kim Jones

My family at St. Helen's, I must share with you about my awesome experience at the You are Leaven Conference I was privileged to attend.

The General Synod of the Anglican Church hosted the conference on Spiritual Formation in Mississauga, the weekend of April 19-22. Laity, deacons, priests and a bishop (62 participants in all) attended from all over Canada and were treated to a truly transformative weekend. The conference was held at the Queen of the Apostles retreat centre, which was a perfect setting for the conference.

The structured learning happened during four workshops held Saturday and Sunday. There were many workshops from which to

choose. The workshops focused on different aspects of spiritual growth, individual and in community. The idea was that we would share what we had learned with other attendees from our team ... in my case this was the Diocese of Ottawa Team and then in turn with our communities at home. These workshops were interspersed with worship of different styles, meals, team discussions and of course, social time. Personally, I attended workshops on Stewardship and Spiritual Gifts, Lectio and Journaling, Goodbye Ceremonies (led by Hilary!), and Sacred Hospitality.

For me, I felt this was a time of renewal in addition to learning and sharing ideas about spiritual formation. The theme... that we are leaven spread through the dough of the Anglican Church as well as our communities, there to ferment ways to bring ourselves and others closer in relationship with our Triune God, came up in homilies, lessons, discussions and workshops. The learning and discussions became like the sugar that feeds the leaven into fermentation. It was a truly blessed time!

We at St. Helen's have been super blessed to have had four people from our parish attend. In addition to myself, Rhonda, who was part of the planning committee, Carl, and Hilary all attended. The workshops were put on by people who were also attending, including our own Rhonda and Hilary. Carl and spouse Sarah (Sarah Johnson, Director of Anglican Studies and Professor of Liturgy at St. Paul's) also hosted a presentation entitled Singing Justice, which brought to mind the different ways we can incorporate the theme of justice into the choices we make about music.

The conference was so meaningful and transformative to the participants that it is likely we will see conferences hosting more locally, in order to make them more accessible. Feel free to ask me questions about this time away. I would love to share more with you!
